

Global: SCHOLARS AT RISK N E T W O R K

- .. is based in USA at New York University
- .. has > 400 member institutions in 40 countries; 9 partner networks / SAR sections
- … places ≈ 100 scholars & provides advice, counselling & other services to ≈ 170 candidates per year
- ... monitors attacks in 50+ countries
- … had > 1.000 scholars participating in workshops, training, conferences
- ... notes a sharp increase in requests for support in 2016 from Turkey and Syria

In the Netherlands:



- Academic Freedom network launched in June 2009
- Netherlands and Belgium: now 21 HEIs
- 107 placements > 2009; 56 individuals
- in 2016, 21 placements, \approx 20% of worldwide numbers
- > 50% scholarly scholars is Human Rights related
- awareness-raising activities: plays, short movies, exhibitions, lectures, debates

- Since 2011: aligned with UAF and SAR programme: Academic Freedom – Scholars at Risk (AF - SaR)



Experiences, concerns and challenges

- Always a positive responses from academic staff
- Language is (sometimes) an issue
- Employment and labour contracts
- Elaborating Academic Freedom as a research and / or teaching topic is not easy
- Feasibility to return home after 1, 2, ... years
- Accommodation after 12 months
- Funding and Fundraising

Institutional Support for Refugee Scholars in HE

Objectives:

- 1. Participating institutions in Thessaloniki, Cologne and Amsterdam are better prepared to provide support for refugee scholars during their academic stay
- 2. Project partners are equipped for building bridges with XX other European HE institutions in the social integration efforts of refugee scholars

Institutional Support for Refugee Scholars in HE

Activity A1: Desk Study.

Develop an inventory of recent initiatives for supporting refugee scholars in Europe.

- Collect and evaluate XX experiences, best practices and support that have recently emerged within European universities with the explicit purpose of supporting refugee scholars.
- Asses the needs that refugee scholars currently have or in the near future might have in relation to a successful stay in an academic department.

Institutional Support for Refugee Scholars in HE

Activity A1: Desk Study.

Develop an inventory of recent initiatives for supporting refugee scholars in Europe.

Sources of information Internet search; Consortium's network; on-line questionnaire with a limited number of questions for identified institutions (XX) and scholars (XX); actively involve SAR, UAF, ...

Deliverable D6.1 Draft Inventory ($\approx 20 - 25$ pages) with recent initiatives and needs of scholars.

Timing: Months 3 - 9

Institutional Support for Refugee Scholars in HE

Activity A2: Academic and Social Integration Discussion

- Discuss and validate D6.1
- Refine a blue-print for involving refuge scholars in university integration efforts.
- Partner with national and European organisations seeking to complement academic integration with social activities and interventions.
- Collaborate with government organizations to improve existing strategies for the integration of refugee scholars.

Activity A2: Academic and Social Integration Discussion

Duration: Round Table. 2 - 3 days; 25 participants. Funds available for F2F? Otherwise: via on-line system (Moodle, Google groups,)

Deliverable D6.2 (i) Report of the Academic and Social Integration Discussion; (ii) Validated Inventory from D6.1

Timing: Months 10 - 15

Institutional Support for Refugee Scholars in HE

Activity A3. Finalizing Deliverable D6.

D6 will consist of:

- online and written and video guide that shares the experiences and recommendations collected and assessed by consortium under the title of "Best-practices";
- methodological framework used to assess and improve upon current strategies and to plan future interventions.

This approach to the development and publication of best practices will be pan-European, multimedia and open to the public.
